The Northern California Chamber Chorale was organized in 1971 by its present director. The Chorale has toured Europe on four occasions. On their second tour, the Chorale was asked to represent the United States in Lyon, France, for their celebrations on July 4th of our bicentennial in 1976. On their third tour, the choir was invited to perform in Poland where they received first prize in the Festival of Music, Gdansk, Poland. In the summer of 1985, the Chorale was the first choir invited to the Shanghai, China, Festival of Music. They toured throughout China, the Colony of Hong Kong, and participated in Japan with other community choirs in concerts and joint festivals.

Some members of the chorus will tour next summer to Europe again under the auspices of the American Choral Directors Association and will end their tour at the International Symposium for Choral Music in Vienna - - the first such symposium held since World War II.

The Harmoneers & Harmonettes began as a men's chorus in 1949 and has grown to a 50-voice mixed chorus, sponsored by Petaluma Adult School. The chorus has presented a major Broadway musical production and a choral concerts annually since 1971. The group has been responsible for funding a music scholarship program for local high school students for over 35 years and has contributed over \$50,000 to local schools for music and theatre equipment. In addition to performing classical and popular repertoire, the chorus features a smaller vocal jazz ensemble.

The Occidental Community Choir is well known for its spirited, original compositions, ranging from folk songs and charales to gospel and jazz. W.A. (Allaudin) Mathieu has directed the choir since 1980 and currently teaches music in Sebastopol. He has worked with the big bands of Stan Kenton and Duke Ellington, acted as musical director of the Second City and Committee Theaters, and taught at the San Francisco Conservatory of Music and Mills College.

The Chorus also serves as a Symphony Chorus for the Santa Rosa Symphony. This fall the Chorus and Symphony will perform Beethoven's Ninth Symphony.
