They have performed with the Master Chorale on numerous occasions since the early 1970s.

Redwood Symphony is sponsored by Cañada College. Known for its innovative programming, it is one of the few community orchestras in the nation distributing commercial compact discs. Collaboration with the Master Chorale began in 1987.
